UCARE Grants

We are proud of the many research and education projects that we have funded over the last ten years. Below is a summary of some of our most recent grants, see our website for more information.

Muscle invasive bladder cancer



Cancer is the 4th most common cancer in UK men, with 10,100 new UK cases of bladder cancer diagnosed annually. The form of the disease which has not penetrated into the bladder muscle is highly curable, but once the tumour grows into the muscle, only half the patients survive long-term.

As a result, many high-risk patients have their bladder removed, but this is overtreatment in many patients and has a significant impact on their quality of life. There is therefore an urgent need to find non-surgical treatments to treat patients in this situation.

Progression of prostate cancer

Prostate cancer (PCa) is the commonest cancer diagnosed in men in the United Kingdom, and the second leading cause of male cancer-related death. It is therefore an important cancer, which poses particular challenges for patients and their clinicians. These challenges include the correct identification of patients who require active treatment, the correct identification of patients whose PCa may not respond optimally to a particular therapy (for example radiotherapy), and therefore may be better treated in an alternative manner, and the identification of key molecules or pathways that drive PCa progression to advanced disease, so that these molecules or pathways can perhaps be blocked with new drugs.

Renal Cell Carcinomas

Renal cell cancer (RCC) is relatively common in the UK, with 12,000 cases diagnosed annually. While advances in the treatment have been made, this disease still accounts for 4000 deaths in the UK each year. We have recently made significant advances in understanding how renal cancers can be specifically killed. Using this approach we hope to identify complementary ways by which to target kidney cancers, which could have considerable clinical benefit.



Growth factor 31 (IGF31)

This project focuses on a protein called insulin-like growth factor (IGF), which helps cancers to grow and spread. Men with high levels of IGF in their blood are at increased risk of getting prostate cancer.

The research team are testing the prostates of men who have had their prostates removed as treatment for prostate cancer, and measuring their blood IGF levels, to try to understand how high IGF increases prostate cancer risk. The long-term goal is to work out how to stop the development of prostate cancer.

Specialised Urological Community Team

Being part of the community is vital to the UCARE specialist nurse team. They are passionate about raising awareness of not just urological cancer but cancer in general. You frequently hear stories about people regretting that they did not know the symptoms of cancer or wishing they had been diagnosed earlier. Ultimately, they aim to increase survival rates through earlier detection by educating local communities and encouraging them to become more aware of their bodies and what is 'normal' for them.
